## Jan. 25 Images of God in the Modern World

What do we mean when we say the word "God" ?? What content do we have in mind? Do we mean a being? A spirit? A force? As our scientific and historical

understandings of the universe have evolved, has this meant an evolution also in our image and understanding of God? In our conversation, we'll be seeking not the "right" answer, but a way of talking with each other about our (probably different) perspectives on what we mean when we say "God" – and how our understanding may have shifted, or be shifting, over time.

**Feb. 1** A Civil Right for Adoptees – An important issue and a chance for our church to advocate within CT. Church member Brian Donohue, adoptive parent and part of a grassroots organization called "Access CT," that works on issues of legal rights for adoptees, is hoping that RHCC will want to learn about and then advocate for the expansion of a current state law. An expanded law would allow persons adopted between 1976 and 1983 to access their original birth certificates and thus information about their biological parentage and history – important for health care and other reasons. This access is not possible under current law. Brian hopes that RHCC will sponsor a resolution to come before the Annual Meeting of the CT Conference of the UCC, in October, 2015, so that the Conference might then become an advocating organization with the CT State Legislature for a revision of the law. The first step to our possibly becoming a sponsoring church is to become informed about the issue. At our second hour on Feb. 1, our guest will be Karen Caffrey, an attorney and psychotherapist, and Director of Access CT.

## Feb. 8, Literalism and the Bible

How do we read Scripture, so as to hear its true meanings? Reading it literally, taking everything at face value, generally creates more questions than answers (e.g, if Adam and Eve were the first two people on earth, and had sons, where did the sons find women to marry, as the Bible says they did? What about all the other things in the Bible that we would find it hard to believe, given what science teaches us about the way things work?). How do we understand these texts other than at a literal level?

## Here's what we're learning about this week...

## LESSON - Jesus, the Storyteller

Jesus was a wonderful storyteller – a teller of theological stories. Jesus crafted word pictures about familiar objects and situations to tell the good news of God's love for all people. This unit we will hear, dramatize, investigate, and live into several of Jesus' stories called parables. We will explore Jesus' parable of the sower, the parable of the yeast, the parable of the bridesmaids, and the parable of the talents.

**Family Treasures.** A loving family is a wonderful gift. Families know us at our best and worst. They meet our needs and teach us to meet those needs for ourselves. Families also care for family stories, preserving them in photo albums, tape recordings, videos, and scrapbooks. Family storytellers also have a role. Who are your family storytellers – those folks whose voices stop all conversation? They may be older with a good sense of humor and a taste for adventure. They are likely to be careful observers whose voices have a way of engaging listeners' imaginations. As these storytellers repeat familiar incidents they remind everyone of family traditions, jokes, shared joys, and sorrows. Their words and gestures capture personalities and events that should be handed carefully from one generation to the next. Be deliberate about teaching your children to listen to these human treasures who tend to treasure your family's stories.

## SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

The next ordering deadline will be the last Sunday in January (Jan 25). Cards ordered by that date will be available for delivery on February 1.
