
#### \*GATHERING PRAYER AND THE LORD'S PRAYER



# CONGREGATIONAL CONVERSATION #5 "CHURCH SHOULDN'T BE THIS HARD" TODAY 11:30 – 12:15

The next in our series of interim process conversations will be based on a recent commentary piece in the Washington Post, by Tom Ehrich, an Episcopal priest and church consultant. The brief piece, which appeared on Jan. 7, 2014, was entitled "Church Shouldn't Be This Hard" and reflects the writer's views on how the church today is impeding itself, through attitudes, expectations and behaviors... and assumptions about clergy roles.

# Here's what we're learning about this week...

COME JOIN THE CIRCLE: Unit 4 - Women Of The Resurrection

#### A Big Rock

Read Mathew 28:1-10. It describes how Jesus' tomb was sealed with a big rock and describes about an earthquake and tells how an angel rolled that big rock away from the opening of the tomb and allowed the women to see inside.

The Easter egg represents many things in the Easter story. Think about the stone rolling from in front of the tomb and a rolling hard boiled egg. Play one of these egg-related games to remember the big rock that was rolled away from the tomb.

**Egg role:** Clear the floor area and gently roll a hard boiled egg toward the center of the space. That egg becomes the target. Each player, in turn, rolls an egg toward the target. It's okay for eggs to bump other eggs. The winner is the player whose egg is closest to the target after everyone has had a turn.

**Egg racing:** If possible, use a grassy slope for this game. Give each player a hard boiled egg and have them mark their eggs for easy identification. Players line up at the top of the hill and, at the same time, roll their eggs down this hill. Whose egg reaches the bottom first? Whose egg rolls the farthest?

**Easter Prayer:** God, we thank you for the gift of Easter. Help us to remember the importance of the big rock that rolled away from your tomb. Help us to hear and share the good news of Jesus' resurrection. *Amen*.



# **Scrip-Sure**

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

We have earned more than \$15,000 for the first 10 months of the current fiscal year. That's almost 30% higher than the earnings for the same period in the prior year. The RHCC budget assumed a 15% growth rate in scrip profits - so we've certainly overachieved on that front. Almost 5% of our total church budget is now funded by the Scrip-Sure program. Keep up the good work!
