





Did you know Rocky Hill Congregational Church is taking steps toward becoming a more energy efficient and environmentally friendly church. We have a Green Team, we have preached an environmental sermon, have a green column in Church Mouse, and recycle paper/plastic. We may be doing more that we are not aware of. We would like to take further steps to becoming more environmentally friendly/energy efficient and there are a number of action steps that can be done in order to be recognized a "Green Congregation." GREEN TIPS

During Lent commit to adding and maintaining at least one green lifestyle item to your life:

- Buy local. Your support of small businesses will eliminate the packing and supplies that shipping online purchases requires.
- Cars fill under inflated tires and remove extra weight from trunk.
- Water -Turn off the tap water when you brush your teeth. This can save up to 200 gallons of water per month.
- Use the car wash -while it may seem like the greener option to wash your car in your driveway, it's actually one of the most environmentally unfriendly things you can do.
 The water that runs off your car usually loaded with gasoline, oil and exhaust residue

— goes straight into storm drains, eventually making its way into rivers, streams and wetlands, where it damages the ecosystem. However, commercial car washes are required by law to drain their wastewater into sewer systems, where it gets treated before being sent back into our waterways.

Want to Make a Difference? Move Your Feet and Join us for a Sole Hope Shoe Party! Sunday, April 5, 5:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. in Chapin Hall

Rocky Hill Congregational Church, 805 Old Main Street, Rocky Hill, CT. Sponsored by Faith Formation Ministry Team

We will start with a simple (provided) meal of soup, salad, and bread, along with mac & cheese for the kids. If anyone cares to make a traditional Ugandan dish, please feel free to bring it. We will then use patterns provided by Sole Hope to cut out pieces from our old jeans that will be turned into shoes by Sole Hope shoemakers in Uganda.

What to bring:

- 1. One or two pairs of old jeans -adult sized, regular denim is recommended. Denim with stretch is not recommended. If children want to donate their jeans, we will find a use for them.
- 2. Fabric scissors, if you have or can borrow some.
- 3. Sole Hope asks that with each pair of shoe tops, we donate \$10, which covers the costs of completing the shoes and transporting them to the children who will wear them. We will take a free will offering at the Shoe Party to help with this donation and then cover the rest from church funds.

Since the scissors will be sharp, we will ask the children to help assemble Soul Hope Care Kits, similar to First Aid kits, which will also be shipped to Uganda.

SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income



for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway – shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

We have most of the usual cards in inventory for immediate purchase this morning. Here is a partial list of cards typically available:

- Coffee: Dunkin Donuts, Starbucks
- Gas: Exxon/Mobil
- Pharmacy: CVS, Walgreens
- Fast food: Burger King, Boston Market, Chipotle, McDonalds, Panera, Subway, Wendy's.
- Restaurants: Bonefish Grill, Outback Steakhouse, Red Lobster
- Shopping: Ace Hardware, Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Bed Bath & Beyond, Home Depot, Jo-Ann Fabrics, Kohl's, iTunes, L.L. Bean, Lowes, Michaels, Target, Total Wine, Walmart.
- Grocery: ShopRite, Big Y, Stop & Shop, Trader Joe's, WholeFoods, Westside Market.

The next order for physical cards not stocked in inventory will be placed on **March 22** (with delivery on March 29). E-cards may be ordered anytime. A complete listing of all retailers available through our program can be picked up at the scrip table in Chapin Hall.

Did you know that you can donate to the Rocky Hill Food Pantry and "Covenant-to-Care for Children" through our scrip program? Your cash/check donations are used to buy gift cards to local groceries (food pantry) or other retail stores (CC). For these donations, we do not retain any profit, so a \$1.00 donation effectively buys about \$1.07 in groceries or clothing.
