



COME JOIN THE CIRCLE: Unit 4 - Women Of The Resurrection

Easter Every Day

Read Mark 16:1-8. It describes how the women came to the tomb at sunrise on the first day of the week. Sunrise has become a symbol of the resurrection and reminds us of new hope in our own lives.

Sunrise happens every day! Get up early, go outside, and watch the sun rise. Imagine what the Easter sunrise might have been like. On Friday you had watched Jesus suffer, die on the cross, and be buried in a tomb. All through the long day of Sabbath you had waited and mourned. How might you have been feeling as you awoke in the pre-dawn darkness? How easy do you think it was to get out of bed? What might you have seen and heard as you met your friends and carried your jars of spices to the tomb? What might you have thought when you saw that the stone had been rolled away? Do you think your first response might have been hope, confusion, fear, anger, or something different? Remember a time in your life when something happened that was beyond your best hopes and give thanks for the gift of Easter.

Easter Prayer: Loving God, thank you for being with us at sunrise moments in our lives, just as you were with Jesus and the women on that first Easter morning. Help us show your love in all that we do and to make every day an Easter. *Amen*.





Scrip-Sure

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins!
