Bring faith and hope to thee forevermore. (Refrain)


*GATHERING PRAYER AND THE LORD'S PRAYER



What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How?
