# THE CONNECTICUT CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST:

The Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ is asking us all to call or email our State Representative and State Senator now to urge them to oppose Senate Bill 1090, which could add up to three additional casinos in our state. While there are individuals opposed to adding these casinos, the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ may be the only faith-based organization in Connecticut, and possibly the only organization, opposing this expansion of casino gambling, so we need our voices to be heard. Delegates to the Conference voted Resolutions in 1977, 1979, and 1994 opposing expanding gambling in Connecticut. When you call or email, if possible, give your name and the town where you live, and let them know that you oppose Senate Bill 1090: An Act Concerning Gaming. You can also say "with gambling expansion and access come increases in problem gambling, and there needs to be more focus on the ill effects and social costs of gambling, not just the financial gain". After you make your calls or send your emails, Michele Mudrick, the Connecticut Conference Legislative Advocate, will be keeping track of what State Representatives and State Senators were contacted, so please email Michele at <a href="michelem@ctucc.org">michelem@ctucc.org</a> or text or call her at <a href="michelem@ctucc.org">860.796.3822</a> to let her know what legislators you contacted that would be helpful.

# Here's what we're learning about this week...

# **LESSON** → Celebrating God's Creation

Read: Genesis 1

#### Reflect and Remember.

"In the beginning God created the Heavens and the Earth." Throughout this unit we will explore our own possibilities for creation and our roles with in God's creation. How do we create? How do we make the world more full of truth and beauty? How do we nurture and care for God's beautiful creation?

Share Your Faith. Talk about the Bible story children and youth explored this week and try this:

- 1) God says to us "Take care of my creation." Talk about ways you are taking caring of creation, and ways you could take better care.
- 2) Do at least 3 things this week to honor and take care of creation. Some examples: Pick up litter on your street, only use reusable products this week, bring your own grocery bags to the store, work on a garden, step outside and say a prayer of thanks for creation.

### **SCRIP-SURE**

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.
