CHILDREN'S OFFERING

During the church school year, the children have given a total of \$52.48 as offering that was collected during their monthly Children's Chapel services. Together, they have decided that half will be donated to True Colors, the Hartford-based organization working to support LGBTQ youth, especially those that are homeless, and half will go to the Connecticut Humane Society, whose rescue work includes both cats and dogs (some of the children prefer cats while others prefer dogs). And since past church school offerings had been left unspent, we will add an extra \$123.76 to each organization, making the total gifts \$150.00 to each organization.

In Memoriam: Dave Hall's father, Percy Hall, passed away peacefully at his home in Ohio on May 30. Although they lived their entire married life in Ohio, Percy and Nancy Hall had a multifaceted connection to Rocky Hill Congregational Church. The choir continues to sing many of Percy's choral arrangements, and some of the instrumental ensemble arrangements performed here over many years were also his. Percy and Nancy also joined the RHCC choir for the Sweden tour in 2003, where Nancy served as the choir accompanist for many performances, and several of Percy's arrangements were sung - with Percy singing in the tenor section. In 2008, RHCC hosted a "Tribute to Percy Hall" concert, featuring many of his compositions and arrangements, with Percy and Nancy in attendance. Percy and Nancy truly thought of RHCC as their "church away from home." Although Percy has now passed into the church eternal, his legacy and gifts will continue to flourish on earth.

Summary of CT Conference UCC Special Meeting, May 18, 2019

The worship service opened with drumming and dancing by Friendz World Music. The Rev. Kari Nicewander delivered the message of needing each other by sharing her recent personal experience in Central Africa. Amazing! In closing, the Blessing Response was performed by the drummers and dancers. A stunning way to open and close a worship service (like in the old days)!

Rev. Kent Siladi in his remarks said he has chosen to not be among those to be chosen for a leadership role in the proposed new Conference. He again urged all to be gentle with each other in this new chapter: to communicate as well as to listen to each other. He also emphasized the importance of bolstering new partnerships in each locality and affirming the success of those already started.

Steve Lane, a member of the First Church of Christ, Mansfield Center, received the Living Waters Award for his work in resettling refugee families by founding Quiet Corner Refugee Resettlement ("QCRR"). To date, QCRR has resettled three families.

Bryan Nurnberger, a former recipient of the Living Waters Award, spoke of his recent work with his Simply Smiles organization. He urged congregations to join a Simply Smiles service trip. So far there are two locations, South Dakota and Oaxaca, Mexico.

The Rev. Ryan Gackenhammer spoke of the benefits of Silver Lake Conference Center and of its successful partnership with Re-Center and Silver Lake's success with recycling. He introduced one of Silver Lake's campers, Tyler, who spoke of his wonderful life-transforming experience. Rev. Gackenhammer is excited for Connecticut to share Silver Lake with Rhode Island and Massachusetts. One more thing - a Clergy Camp is scheduled and he urged the congregations to send their clergy to this camp session!

Finally, three resolutions were presented: 1) A Resolution of Affirmation to End the Practice of Prolonged Solitary Confinement in Connecticut Prisons & Jails; carried; 2) A Resolution of Affirmation Regarding Citizenship of Certain Foreign-Born Children Adopted by American Citizens; carried; and 3) A Resolution of Affirmation Regarding Child Marriage & Forced Marriages; not carried.

Each and every day at Rocky Hill Congregational Church, we depend upon you to support the work of our church. Did you know that in April, we:

- Participated in the **Walk Against Hunger**. Money raised from this walk support Foodshare's efforts to fight hunger year-round as well as support programs in Tolland and Hartford county that help our neighbors who are struggling with food insecurities.
- Created **Sole Care Kits**. Thousands of men and women in Uganda suffer from a crippling parasite called jiggers, which is contracted through the feet. To help our friends around the globe, our Board of Faith Formation hosted a Sole Party. Simply by donating old jeans and following a pattern provided by Sole Hope, we were able to create these kits. Local Ugandans are paid to assemble the shoes which are then given to those in need, so each gift gives twice!
- Donated to a Connecticut shelter for migrant children. Noank Community Support Services (located near Groton) is home to between 10 and 12 unaccompanied children (mostly teens) from the border. Those children depend on donations from organizations like our church.
- Visited those who cannot join us at church events or Sunday service. Our devoted and caring Congregational Care Team ensures that we stay in touch with our church family and friends in many ways including visiting, calling and writing a note.
- Lived our vision of being **a welcoming church**. A welcoming committee was formed whose mission it is to ensure that we don't just say "no matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are all welcome here" but we actively demonstrate it. Beginning in April, every person entering the sanctuary through the vestibule is welcomed by a greeter with a warm and friendly smile.
- Worked to **keep our church safe** and sound for our generation and all the generations to come. For example, one of our members is responsible for ensuring all doors are locked after Sunday morning services.

All of these things are planned and prepared by leadership and staff who are deeply committed to our becoming who God is calling us to be. We have a vision that is amazing and exciting, but we can't achieve our vision without your continued contributions of time, talent and treasure. These are the resources that fuel our mission; and yes, it does cost real money to provide spiritual things.

We thank all of you for believing in our vision and mission and working in so many ways to help make our vision a reality.

SCRIP-SURE



What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

We have most of the usual cards in inventory for immediate purchase this morning. Here is a partial list of cards typically available:

➤ Coffee: Dunkin Donuts, Starbucks

Gas: Exxon/Mobil, Shell, Sunoco

➤ Pharmacy: CVS, Walgreens

Fast food: Boston Market, Chipotle, McDonalds, Panera, Subway, Wendy's

➤ Shopping: Ace Hardware, Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Bed Bath & Beyond, Home Depot, Jo-Ann Fabrics, Kohl's, iTunes, L.L. Bean, Lowes, Michaels, Target, Total Wine, Walmart.

Grocery: Big Y, Stop & Shop, Trader Joe's, WholeFoods, Westside Market

The next order for physical cards not stocked in inventory will be placed on July 14 (with delivery on July 21). E-cards may be ordered anytime. A complete listing of all retailers available through our program can be picked up at the scrip table in Chapin Hall.

Did you know that you can donate to the Rocky Hill Food Pantry and "Covenant-to-Care for Children" through our scrip program? Your cash/check donations are used to buy gift cards to local groceries (food pantry) or other retail stores (CC). For these donations, we do not retain any profit, so a \$1.00 donation effectively buys about \$1.07 in groceries or clothing. You may donate at the scrip table in Chapin Hall.
