A memorial service was held at Thursday, June 7, 2018 at the Center Congregational Church, 474 Broad Street, Meriden. Kenneth Page Cowing was born in Malden, Massachusetts on August 1, 1923. He was the son of the Rev. Clarence J. and Alice Lewis Cowing. Ken served in World War II from 1943 to 1946. After the war Ken returned to his employment at Home National Bank in Meriden where he spent the rest of his career. During his tenure there he rose from bank teller to Assistant Vice President. Ken was active in the Meriden Historical Society for decades. He enjoyed puttering in his workshop, hiking and chess. Ken and his wife, Louise Durand Lacey, were active in Center Congregational Church in Meriden, Connecticut, where they raised their three sons, Keith, Craig and Bruce Cowing.

SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do



at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers
