To me, the best part of any worship service is the singing of the hymns, especially those familiar ones of long ago. They bring back nostalgic memories of incidents, places, and people. Of special reference is my grandmother who sang hymns and spirituals whenever, wherever and at any time the spirit led her to do so. During the years I have added my own favorites to those that had been imbedded in me over the years, and

now I sing whenever, wherever, and any time the spirit leads me, as my grandmother did. I realize that I do not have the voice of a nightingale, but that is of no consequence to me.

It is not surprising, therefore, that as I went through the list of workshops slated for today at General Synod 2017, the one on "Experiencing the African American Spirituals" became a 'must' for me. Attendees were informed that spirituals originated from the enslaved African people and were regarded as work songs, signal songs, meeting songs, etc. We spent the best part of the hour enthusiastically singing to several familiar spirituals. There were some that I and some others had not heard before but, as is usually the case with spirituals, we quickly picked up the words and joined in the singing. Thanks to Jeannette Brown and her co-presenter for spearheading a relaxing hour to end my second day at Synod.

On Monday afternoon, Bob Inderbitzen helped represent the resolution advocating for the rights of adult adoptees to access their original birth certificate. While the resolution garnered a majority of favorable votes, it didn't achieve the 2/3 majority required for passage. SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program

for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do



at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers

We have most of the usual cards in inventory for immediate purchase this morning. Here is a partial list of cards typically available:

- Shopping: Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Bed Bath & Beyond, Home Depot, Kohl's, iTunes, L.L. Bean, Lowes, Michaels, Payless Shoes, Target, Toys R Us, Walmart

The next ordering deadline for cards not kept in inventory will be on Sunday, July 30th (delivery on August 6).

Did you know that you can donate to the Rocky Hill Food Pantry and "Covenant-to-Care for Children" through our scrip program? Your cash/check donations are used to buy gift cards to local groceries (food pantry) or other retail stores (CC). For these donations, we do not retain any profit, so a \$1.00 donation effectively buys about \$1.07 in groceries or clothing. You may donate at the scrip table in Chapin Hall.
