



SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

Cards ordered last Sunday are available for pickup this morning. We had our best August results ever, with profits of approximately \$1300 - the first time we've ever topped the \$1000 mark in August. During the month, 35 members and friends ordered cards with a total face amount of almost \$20,000. Thanks to everyone who continues to support this vital fundraising program.
