



These faith nurture ideas coordinate with the weekly session plans for church school. We hope you will join us in learning, teaching, and growing together!

<u>Here's what we're learning about this week...</u>

HEROES OF THE BIBLE. There is Daniel, Jonah, Joshua, Noah, David, Miriam and Moses, Esther, Jesus, Peter and John, Dorcas, Paul, Lydia, and many more. There are those that don't even get a name, men and woman who have great faith, who ask difficult questions, who speak up for justice, and even a child who shares his lunch so 5000 can be fed. They are never perfect people, they make mistakes, they are human, but when it matters they are brave, compassionate, giving, and have great faith. The heroes of the bible are often unexpected, teaching us that the ordinary can be extraordinary, and with God's love all things are possible.

LESSON - Favorite Bible Stories: The Good Samaritan

Scripture: Daniel 6:1-28

Talk About the Bible story children and youth explored this week. Here are some ways to nurture faith at home based on this week's story: (1) Memorize this week's Bible Verse, Psalm 113:3 "The name of the Lord is to be praised"; (2) Talk about choices you have made in your life based on your faith. Was it easy to keep your faith? Was it hard? Do you regularly think about your faith as you make choices? (3) Have each family member share something that is really difficult for them to do, perhaps it's something they have been avoiding, support them in completing that task this week.

Prayer For The Week: (*This is a body prayer, follow the motions as you pray*). We praise you, God, - hands come to the center to form praying hands and move up and out, extending overhead. In the morning – put both hands beside face, fingers outstretched making a smiling morning face. We praise you, God, - repeat first action. In the evening – place hands together, under side of face and pretend to sleep. We praise you, God, - repeat first action. All the time – hands outstretched, turn all the way around. Amen. – fold hands in prayer.

The RHCC S.P.I.R.I.T. Church School is a place that values intergenerational relationships, growing in faith, and learning throughout our lives to be the disciples Christ calls us to be. You are invited to come join the circle and get involved. For the 2014 church school we are looking for:






Liberating Hope.

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway – shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.
