





SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

If you placed a scrip order at the end of November, you may pick up your cards at the scrip table in Chapin Hall this morning. During November, more than \$30,000 of scrip was sold, producing a profit for RHCC of more than \$2200, our second best month ever.

We will place one more scrip order prior to Christmas. Orders should be submitted by December 14th, and cards will be available for pickup on December 21. LIGHT A CANDLE DECEMBER 14





COMING AFTER THE HOLIDAYS.....

Things I've Always Wondered about Christianity (But Was Afraid to Ask)

A small-group exploration series based on topics provided by the congregation.

It's been my experience in many years of ministry that we are often carrying questions and struggles about very basic ideas, beliefs or meanings within the Christian faith that we don't feel we understand very well, or that may once have made sense to us but now make less sense, or that seem ill-fitting in some way with how we have experienced God or our own faith. It's good to have a community of others to talk with about those challenges. (For one thing, we generally find we're not alone in having them). This will be designed as a series of small-group conversations within which any and all questions, doubts or struggles can be shared, and we'll explore them together.

Examples:

I never did believe in the Virgin Birth. Does that mean I'm not Christian?

I have a lot of trouble with all the violence of God in the Bible. Am I supposed to believe that's really what God is like?

So much in the Bible is not plausible, scientifically or literally. Am I expected to believe it all literally? What if I don't?

I used to believe in a "substitutionary atonement" (Jesus' death was in our place, "paid for" our sins) but now that seems absurd to me. How does someone else's death relieve my quilt?

I struggle with what to tell my children when bad things happen in the world. What can I tell them about God...?

THE MEANING OF ADVENT

A LIGHT SHINES IN THE DARKNESS



Advent (from the Latin word 'adventus,' meaning 'coming') is a season of spiritual preparation for the celebration of the birth of Christ (Christmas), and looks forward as well to the future reign of Christ in the fullness of time. Observed for centuries in the Christian Church, and encompassing the four weeks before the church's celebration of Christ's birth, Advent is a preparation for, rather than a celebration of, Christmas, and is a season distinct from Christmas. In the church, the celebration of Christmas begins on Christmas Eve and continues for the next "twelve days of Christmas" (called "Christmastide"), until Epiphany (January 6).

In the Western Church, Advent is the beginning of a new liturgical year. A new cycle of liturgical readings (designed for Year A, B or C of the three-year cycle) begins with the first Sunday of Advent, and continues through the last Sunday after Pentecost, until a new church year begins with the next Advent.

Like Lent, Advent is a preparatory season....a time of looking forward and waiting for something greater, and discovering the spiritual value of readying ourselves and our lives for the inbreaking of God. Also as in Lent, the traditional liturgical color for Advent is purple, though beginning in recent years, the color blue, associated with Mary, is also used.

One of the most beloved symbols of this season is the Advent wreath. The circle of evergreens symbolizes the eternal and ever-renewing promises of God. The progressive lighting of candles (hope, peace, joy, love) marks our hoping and living in the increasing light, toward the full light of Christ that we celebrate at Christmas (the white Christ Candle is lit on Christmas Eve).

"Come, Lord Jesus!" are Advent's traditional words. They are, in fact, the words found at the very end of the very last book in the Bible (Revelation). There is a sense in which, in the church "it is always Advent." (Richard Rohr). We are always waiting, preparing, hoping, living toward the light, and watching for God's Word to take flesh in us and in our world. Advent is our beautiful season for expressing what is always true for people of faith.
