Come and announce your Word to us,


disturb us with its newness, awaken us to its promise, and help us bring it to birth --





Mexico has a celebration called Los Posadas. This is a reenactment of the journey of Mary and Joseph to find a safe place to stay in Jerusalem and have their baby. Los Posadas happens during the last 12 days of Advent. Each night Mary and Joseph go from house to house asking if there is room for them to stay. Some places say there is "no room," just like the inn keeper. But finally, on Christmas Eve, there is one place that welcomes Mary and Joseph to stay.

Our hearts and our homes must be open to all who need help and hospitality, just like Mary and Joseph did. Scan the news this week. Look around your office. Look around your school. Take a closer look at your neighborhood. Who needs our welcome, prayers, and hospitality?

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

LIGHT A CANDLE TONIGHT DECEMBER 14


