



Oh, join with me, in gladness sing, To keep our Christmas with our King; The David's harp strings, hushed so long, Shall swell our jubilee of song!



These faith nurture ideas coordinate with the weekly session plans for church school. We hope you will join us in learning, teaching, and growing together!

Here's what we're learning about this week...

LESSON → Los Posadas

Mexico has a celebration called Los Posadas. This is a reenactment of the journey of Mary and Joseph to find a safe place to stay in Jerusalem and have their baby. Los Posadas happens during the last 12 days of Advent. Each night Mary and Joseph go from house to house asking if there is room for them to stay. Some places say there is "no room," just like the inn keeper. But finally, on Christmas Eve, there is one place that welcomes Mary and Joseph to stay.

Who will you invite into the inn? Practice hospitality this week. Invite someone you haven't before to Christmas Eve service. Bring a plate of warm christmas cookies to a neighbor. Look for God in the world, and pray in places you normally wouldn't

SCRIP-SURE

What is it? Scrip-sure is a fundraising program for our church, which allows the regular shopping we do at a variety of retailers to generate income for the church. How? Participating retailers sell gift certificates or gift cards to our church at a discount. Church members buy the certificates for full face value and redeem them for full face value, and our church keeps the difference as revenue. Everybody wins! The retailers get our business, and our church gets a regular source of revenue that involves nothing other than what we would all be doing anyway — shopping/spending at grocery stores, drugstores, restaurants, gas stations, and many other businesses, including online retailers.

In the first half of December, 45 members & friends bought or ordered scrip, producing a net profit of almost \$1000. We also achieved a milestone last week, as we reached \$1,000,000 in total scrip sales since our program started five years ago. See the January newsletter for more details on this achievement.

All orders are in and can be picked up at the scrip table this morning. 
