

November is the time for Thanksgiving. As we gather around our tables and say prayers of thanks for all that we have, we must also pray in deep thanksgiving for the generosity of our church family. Because of you, we were able this year to help so many people, not just at the holidays, but all throughout the year. Because of your weekly giving and pledging towards the benevolence budget, we were able to fund all the giving we had budgeted for the fiscal year. And because of your generous fund raising, we were able to send travelers to Biloxi, Walk against Hunger, support Mission:1, and many other worthy causes this year so far. Mission:1 – Sunday, November 6

The Mission:1 initiative helps people in 3 very important ways:

1. We collected our usual **Neighbors in Need** offering on Sunday, October 2, offerings that will be shared for hunger-action purposes with agencies of justice and compassion throughout the United States.

2. We will collect over 1000 items of healthy shelf-stable food on November 6th for the **Rocky Hill Food Pantry** for folks right here in town! Please bring in your shopping bags, which you received in church! If you did not get one, and would like to participate, call the church office, or stop by and pick one up.

3. We will write over 50 letters to our elected officials as part of the **Bread for the World Offering of Letters**, asking our government to reform U.S. foreign assistance in a way that more effectively benefits hungry and poor people worldwide! We will have a table set up on November 6^{th} with some sample letters and instructions.

Please consider participating in this event, and help our neighbors near and far!

Calling All Coupons!!

Starting in November, RHCC, UCC will be collecting coupons to support the "5Loaves/2Fishes" Project started by Donna Gagnon. Collection boxes will be located outside the church office, and in Chapin Hall. Bring your coupons in any time and they will be clipped and distributed for use in 3 different ways:

- 1. Local Food Pantry Needs
- 2. Care Packages for Troops Serving Overseas
- 3. Humane Society and Animal Shelters

Coupons and circulars of all kinds are welcome and can used for many purposes. No need to cut them out. We will do that for you!

Food pantry needs commonly include: Canned tuna/chicken, Beef stew, Juice boxes, Granola bars, Canned fruits, Rice, Soup, Potatoes, Peanut butter, Jelly, Pasta sauce, Paper products, Dry pasta

The town pantry also needs the following sanitary items: Toothpaste/toothbrushes, Soap, Shampoo, Deodorant, Baby wipes, Laundry detergent, Deodorant

A small cart pulled by a cow left Nagpur in 1868 and travelled for five days carrying Rev. Oscar Lohr to Bishrampur, India. He was the first missionary in the region from the United States representing the United

Church of Christ. In 1885 another cart left Jabalpur and travelled for three days through the tiger infested forests of what we call Kahna National Park to Bilsapur. In this were three ladies Miss Anna Boyd, Miss Kingsley and Mrs. Adams representing the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the US.

Missionary Anil Henry writes, I am in India today on behalf of the many missionaries who followed, and the congregations of these two mainline churches of America that were two of the six churches that joined in the unification of the Church of North India. I am filled with thanksgiving every day for their vision and hope. It is not only my seven years of service with the Church of North India on behalf of Global Ministries in Mungeli, but a second generation of mission work that continues after the legacy of my parents namely my mother Mrs. Nancy Henry who was sent out by the United Church of Christ 50 years ago as a young missionary nurse, and later married my father Dr. VK Henry.

In the small area of Mungeli, we try to show God's love through the running of a hospital (120 beds) and school (500 children). We ask for strength as we move toward the construction of a new school building, a cancer center, starting nursing education and working with the community to help them better understand that our faith has very little value if we do not have action along with it.

We pray with the Henrys, asking God to transform our lives with courage and cleanse us so that we may be better vessels of God's work.

Anil and Teresa Henry serve the Synodical Board of Health Services of the Church of North India. Both work as medical doctors and Anil as director of the Christian Hospital in Mungeli. They are supported in part by One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS).




