A Message From Let your light shine!

This was the theme for the now just completed 26th Synod of the United Church of Christ in Hartford. It was a marvelous time filled with spirited worship, singing and preaching, passionate and committed presenters, conversation and connection with former colleagues and friends, forging of new relationships with church members around the country, and cookies, cookies, cookies!

Many in our congregation volunteered or attended the Synod, and can give you personal testimony about the power of the Spirit and the light so evident for five days. Ask them! Jonathan's extraordinary efforts over the last two years as the co-chair of the local arrangements committee were evident everywhere, and Bob Inderbitzen was never seen without a walkie-talkie or cell phone smoothing out any and all logistical problems!

I know many of you followed the Synod by reports in the newspaper or via the internet. What wasn't captured in print or video, however, were some of the extraordinary moments of light that made the Synod so powerful for me:

- the light shining in the eyes of young people listening to Rev. DaVita McAllister preach *to* them and *for* them

- the tears of joy and gratitude shed by Marion Wright Edelman, after hearing a song tribute by extraordinary musician Ken Medema

- hearing the Biblical word proclaimed in multiple languages
- the sweet sound of Amazing Grace sung in round by synod delegates and visitors in the sanctuary of Center Church in Hartford
- 1500 persons participating in a ritual of anointing at the closing worship
- relishing in the diversity of body, spirit, theology, traditions and t-shirt slogans!

It was a joyful anniversary celebration, a time to reflect on all that our denomination has accomplished during the last 50 years. But it was not a time to rest on laurels or past achievements. The work of the church and the work of Christ still needs to be done, perhaps even more so in a world that desperately hungers of food, for peace, for love, and for justice. That is true of our denomination, and also true of our congregation.

We all have been given the light of Christ. As we go forward into the future, let us listen to our still-speaking God so that we may know where to go to let it shine!

And we are all looking forward to a time of fellowship and planning when the Diaconate goes on their annual retreat. What a wonderful way to end the summer.

Council News

Council will not be meeting over the summer, but we had a busy May and June with many items on our agenda. Here's a quick summary:

- Chapin Hall was one of those big items. At my first Council meeting as the new Moderator, the Council unanimously endorsed the proposal to renovate Chapin Hall and to bring it to the congregation for approval. Whew! What a way to begin! The congregation approved it by a very large majority at the Annual Meeting on June 3. Since that time we have been busy getting the design-build firm under contract. Some testing will take place and then we anticipate that construction will begin late in July. Meanwhile, we hope to see many of you at "The Last Supper" on July 12th, when we will have our last potluck supper in the "old" Chapin Hall. When the renovations are complete, we will have a "First Supper" to celebrate (do I sense a "food" theme here?) We all owe a big debt of gratitude to Bob Inderbitzen and the rest of the Chapin Hall Restoration Committee who worked long and diligently to develop the plan (and who will continue to work hard to see it through to completion).
- The Council also approved the formation of a search committee to find a new Director of Christian Education (DCE)—hopefully someone who can start in the fall at the beginning of our church school year. Subsequent to that, a question was raised by several as to whether we should continue to seek a new DCE, or whether we should go back to having a volunteer (or stipend-rewarded) Church School Superintendent. The CE Board discussed this issue and felt very strongly that a DCE is needed to keep us moving forward and that a Church School Superintendent would feel like a move backward. The CE Board presented their feelings to Council in an open letter (available in the Narthex to anyone who is interested). The Council unanimously supported the decision of the CE Board in continuing with the DCE search.
- The Diaconate presented the Council with several recommendations:
 - The first was to authorize our clergy to officiate at civil union ceremonies in our sanctuary and chapel.

• The second was to begin an open church-wide discussion regarding becoming an Open and Affirming (ONA) church—open to full acceptance of all, regardless of sexual orientation. The ONA process addresses the questions: What does ONA mean? Are we already an open and affirming church "in spirit"? If not, do we want to become one? What is our vision in this regard?

Both of these recommendations grew out of our previous visioning process. The Council unanimously endorsed the recommendations of the Diaconate. The Diaconate plans to begin this dialogue process in the fall.

- We have formed a committee to lead us in celebrating the 200th anniversary of our beautiful meeting house in 2008!! So far, the committee consists of Linda Tokarski (who will chair the committee), Jayne Bishop, Marsha Hoffman, Cheryl Hummel and Donna. If you would like to be on this committee, please call Linda Tokarski especially if you are male, as the committee currently lacks male representation. Linda's phone number is 633-8413.
- In other news, the Trustees report that they are "ready to roll" on the painting of the church (also approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting), so we will be "lookin' good" for that 200th anniversary celebration.
- Finally, the Council bid a reluctant farewell to Phil Swain who served as our Moderator for quite a few years. We celebrated with cake at the May Council meeting and also presented Phil with a clock at the Annual Meeting in honor of all of the time that he has devoted to our church. In addition to his time as Moderator, Phil has been a loyal and unselfish volunteer in so many different ways. We were delighted that Phil agreed to be on the new DCE search committee—so he didn't get much of a rest between activities.

We look forward to a relaxing summer off from Council activities and to resuming in September.

Please be aware that there are now stricter legal and ethical guidelines regarding the dissemination of patient information from hospitals to churches and clergy. Today's shorter hospital stays make timely pastoral visits difficult. If you have occasion to be hospitalized, you or ld do two things:
